School Drop Off Initially retain Summer practice	A member of staff will welcome families on the roadside and children from Years 1-4 will enter the school by walking up to the playground on the school pathway from 8:50am. Reception Class will be welcomed at the main school entrance by classroom staff between 8:50 and 8:55am. No group mixing on the playground before school to avoid across school transmission. Handover outside playground avoids congestion at single entry/exit gate at the playground.
