Comments and Actions

- All of the classes have now filled in the pupil voice survey - Mrs Hart shared the results with School Council:
 - The majority of responses were positive! Children love coming to our school, enjoy the work and feel safe here. Hooray!
 - It came out that quite a few children didn't enjoy a challenge so the School Council will consider how to address this.
- One survey response suggested unhappiness at lunchtime and some children have mentioned in the past that they don't like seeing food waste. Nell said that, on days when she doesn't like the food, she doesn't eat it so it is wasted. Felix said that he absolutely loves the dinners at school because they are delicious but he loved having a choice at his old school. He gave the example that on Friday, children could choose whether they wanted a sausage roll or fish fingers with their chips.
- School Council talked about this and agreed that they would all like a choice at lunch to cut down on waste but that it was important to ask all of the children in school.
 - School Councillors to return to class and ask whether or not pupils would like a choice at lunch.
 - 14/14 Reception children would like a choice at lunch.
 - 27/28 Y1/2 children would like a choice at lunch.
 - 24/25 Y3/4 children would like a choice at lunch.
- Mrs Hart asked School Council whether they liked the choice of salad on the table. Myla said that sometimes it is already all gone when she sits down because it is a very small portion or that all of the cucumber is gone and just tomato left, which she doesn't like. She would like to have a "buffet" to choose from then everyone could have what they liked. Mrs Hart showed the School Council examples of salad bars on the Edmentals website and they all agreed it would be a fantastic addition to dinners.
 - Mrs Hart/Miss Ainsley to ask the PTA to fund the salad bar.

- As suggested by Myla during the last meeting, Mrs Hart asked what should be done about football being played every day on the playground. The School Council unanimously agreed to “no ball” days and it was decided these would be Tuesday and Thursday every week.
