TIMETABLE AND ROUTINES

- Mrs Burton or Mrs Paterson available to speak to you before/ after school or email the admin address and we'll get back to you
- One adult welcomes the children while the other begins teaching straight away
- Morning timetable will lead to more directed/focused activities
- Afternoon timetable is more flexible – child initiated time
- Children play in the EY garden after lunch – they will begin transition into other areas when they're ready
- Water bottles/book bags to be brought into school daily
- Wellies and PE kits in school at all times (PE kits to come home at half term to be washed/maintained)

TYPICAL TIMETABLE

- 8:55-9:05 – self - registration (children engaged in reading or counting activities straight away)
 - 9:05-9:30 – table top activities
- 9:30-10:15 – Literacy focus activities (large group and small group)
 - 10:15-10:30 – Snack/Story/Social time
- 10:30-11:30- Maths focus activities (large group and small group)
 - 11:30-11:50- Story/Special Person/Collective Worship
 - 11:50-12:15 – lunch in hall
 - 12:15-1:00- outdoor play EY garden
- 1:00-3:00 – Plan/do/review (children choosing own learning opportunities)

SPECIAL DAYS

- Thursday AM (Forest School with Sarah and Music with Mr Reed)
 - Thursday PM– PE with Mr Thompson
- Mrs Paterson is always with them on Thursday alongside the other adults
 - Friday PM – RE based provision

HOW TO HELP AT HOME

Reading

- Read every night (does NOT need to be school books provided) Add any relevant responses into the reading scrapbook
- Staged book to be reviewed regularly and moved to next stage as/when appropriate
- Children engage in reading daily through phonics/RWI and read 1:1 with an adult at least 1 x per week
 - ‘Tricky words’ will be sent home on a keyring to practise reading
- Children need to be able to read these and write some of them by the end of reception
 - Website/app links to be sent out as and when we use them either via Tapestry/website

HOW TO HELP AT HOME

Tapestry

- Check weekly and 'like' what we send
- Upload anything you feel will help with your child's assessment – swimming achievements/cycling etc
 - Reception newsletter – info only
