## Primary Curriculum Driver: L (Literacy)

Once we've settled back into school and set ourselves some targets and goals, we will turn our attention to learning to write simple phrases.


Each day children will continue to take part in a reading and phonics session. They will be able to apply their phonics when reading simple words and phrases. Alongside this, children will learn to read a range of common exception words.

Using the core text of **Dear Dinosaur**, the children will learn to write facts about themselves using their phonic knowledge as well as spelling some common exception words.

# Secondary Curriculum Driver: CLL (Communication and Language)

As always, speaking and listening and building up our vocabulary will have a high priority in our curriculum. We will continue to recall our learning opportunities through daily review time.

We will also build up our vocabulary by learning the meaning of new and unknown words. We will be learning to name different dinosaurs and other topic related vocabulary linked to garden birds and the Lunar New Year.

During STEM fortnight, children will be able to discuss their plans with their friends, learn how to make a prediction and then discuss their observations.

#### Understanding the World:

Every day, special person will observe and record the weather and we will use these observations to compare with the previous day. As winter progresses we need to remember to look after the garden birds we see in our local environment. We will make bird feeders and observe any activity we see. Taking part in the Big Garden Bird Watching Weekend will support our knowledge and understanding of birds and we will learn why some birds stay in England and others leave. We will explore some of the places different birds migrate to and compare the weather and environment. In RE, we will answer the question 'Where do I belong?' We will think about the different groups we belong to and why they are important to us and will learn all about a Baptism. We will carry out a service of our own at Church.

## Mathematical Development:

We will continue to work with the White Rose Maths scheme in our daily sessions. We will consolidate our knowledge on how numbers to 5 are made. We will hopefully be able to recall all number partners to 5. For example, 5+0, 4+1, 3+2 and so on. We will also be introduced to comparing using the vocabulary such as heavier than and lighter than. We will also introduce the children to the concept of capacity as we take on many different challenges in both the indoor and outdoor environment.

Alongside this, we will continue to develop our problem solving skills in real life contexts using snack time and cookery activities as a starting point. Using numicon, we will be identifying which numbers are odd and which numbers are even.

### Personal, Social and Emotional:

Now we know what the Christian Values are, we will look for friends who are displaying these each day. These friends will be celebrated with a special note on our value display.

Alongside this, our Commando Joe's activity reinforces personal development by setting up different team challenges. This half term we will be working on developing empathy towards others.

## Physical Development:

Now we know all of the letters through working so hard on phonics, we will spend some time each morning practising the formation of these. Each morning we will take part in dough-disco, strengthening our hand muscles ready to write at length.

In PE with Mr Thompson, the children will mainly work indoors completing some indoor athletic challenges.

#### Expressive Arts and Design:

At the beginning of the year, the children all painted self-portraits. We will begin the term by repeating this to compare with their first attempts. This time we will use simple line drawings. We will continue to explore what happens when we colour mix as well as creating our own mark-making and painting tools. Our role play area will begin as an animal hospital where we will be able to act out our own experiences.

# Help at home by .....

- Encourage your child to dress independently (especially coats and gloves!)
- Read a bedtime story to your child each night
- Find a calm time to read the school books or similar at least 5 times per week
- Practise reading and writing the tricky words given on the key ring regularly
- Encourage the correct letter formation
- Point out numbers, shapes and patterns in the world around you
- Talk about what they have done at school (it's ok if they say 'nothing' or 'I can't remember!')
- Use tapestry to share all of their home achievements
