Autumn Term

Dear Parents,

Welcome back - I hope everyone had a great summer. The holidays seemed to have flown past but it is good to see everyone back at school.



We welcome and wish happy times to new staff and children. We have a new Teaching Assistant in Year 1 and 2 - Mrs Helen Hunter. At the start of this year Helen will also be working in Reception Class. Some of you may know Helen as she lives in the village and her children attended pre-school. We would also like to welcome Mrs Gillian Wilkinson who is working with Marrie as Kitchen Assistant and as our Dinner Supervisor.

We have new starters in Reception class so would like to say a special hello to Beatrice, Benjamin, Harry, Jack, Joseph, Liam Matthew, Molly and Myla - we hope they and their families are going to enjoy days at Broomhaugh.

The work that was being carried out at school on the roof and front of building was only completed this weekend please bear with us as we are still sorting some things out in the building as we have not been able to have access to all of our rooms. However we hope you agree the school now looks very smart and should be warmer with better insulation on the roof.

I would like to give a few reminders about general procedures that make life so much easier for us all.

- Please ensure everyone arrives at school in time for the bell at 8.55am. A
 member of staff will be in the yard from 8.50am onwards so you are able
 to leave children then. Children come out of school at 3.15pm. If you are
 not picking your child up we need to have a message to tell us who is
 collecting them or else we will not allow your child to go home with
 another parent/aunt/grandparent etc
- Reception parents may come in with their child when the bell goes but all
 other children should be coming in to school themselves our entrance is
 not big enough to accommodate parents as well as the children.
- If you have a message to give to a member of staff this MUST be done before the bell goes - as soon as the children start to come in to school all staff are busy welcoming them and cannot talk to parents at that point.



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- If your child is absent from school we need to know so we need to receive a message - preferably by telephone to inform us of their absence before the start of the day
- PE kits should be in small bags on pegs for the whole week that way if a
 child gets very wet or muddy they all have a change of clothes at school.
 If it is possible to avoid other bags (large backpacks), apart from reading
 book bags we would be grateful as cloakrooms can get very crowded
- We do not wear shoes in school children are very welcome to bring in sensible slippers to wear ie not huge novelty slippers
- We go out to play in all weathers so children need to have appropriate outdoor clothing and wellies
- Please remember to park considerately in the village last term the parking officer was frequently at school and I would hate anyone to start the term with a fine to pay!
- Any money that needs to be sent to school dinner, swimming, milk etc should be sent in a labelled envelope with the child's name and what the money is for clearly written on the front
- Anyone who needs an inhaler or EpiPen at school needs to fill in a medical form in the school office - please ensure these are up to date
- PLEASE NAME ALL UNIFORM INCLUDING SHOES AND WELLIES
