Dear Families,

What a wonderful start to Spring 2 we have had!

On Wednesday we held our annual Rainbow Day, where we celebrate equality, diversity and inclusion, and everyone agreed it was such a magical day. Seeing the children come together on the playground really did encapsulate the wonder of a rainbow: we are all individually amazing but together we make something extraordinary!

This year we celebrated neurodiversity and made links to mental health and wellbeing. Very simply, neurodiversity refers to the different ways a person's brain processes information. Those who are neurodivergent make up a large percentage



of our society and school communities. Research from the NHS states that up to 1 in 7 people in the U.K may be neurodivergent. Neurodiversity includes those with dyslexia, ASD, ADHD, OCD, Developmental coordination disorder (dyspraxia), dyscalculia, stammering and Tourette's Syndrome.

Throughout the day, the children took part in different activities and workshops to help them better understand the theme. Fiona Willis from the NCC ASD team came to read to the children in assembly and they loved the book, 'All Cats are on the Autistic Spectrum.' Miss. Storey visited classes with 'Winston Wallaby Can't Stop Bouncing,' another superb book all about ADHD. There were sessions on wellbeing, mindfulness and the Zones of Regulation as well as friendship-



based activities. The children also learnt about the history of the Pride Flag (as part of LGBTQ+ History Month) and designed their own flags to represent what makes them special and unique.

Finally, as if that wasn't enough, we also held the Great Rainbow Bake Off! As always, we were blown away by the cakes and biscuits made by the children and the standard of decoration. Thanks to your generosity, we have raised £115 for Tanga Club, which is going to make such a difference to the lives of those in our local community.

I am so proud of our children for their kindness, openness and empathy. We really are being the best we can be!
