Lesson	Activity/ Link
1	Using a computer, laptop or a tablet and with support from an adult:
	Open a web browser.
	 Build confidence navigating a web page of your choice.
	• Observe how the mouse changes from an arrow to a pointed hand, which indicates
	a link to something else. (This feature will not be available on a tablet).
	Experiment clicking on links.
	 Click on the back arrow at the top of the web browser to return to a previous
	screen. (This function will be different on a tablet).
	 Try out a different web page, how is this different/ similar?
2	Choose a website to browse.
	• Explore the various kinds of content you can find; words, pictures, film clips,
	animations, games and quizzes.
3	 Using the internet skills acquired so far, choose a famous person or historical
	character to research.
	• Find out some key facts about the person; date of birth, place of birth, what they
	do/ did and any other interesting facts you can find.
	 Print out the information you have found out, or make some notes about your
	research.
4	 Prepare a short script based on your research from the previous session.
	 Introduce your character, explain who they are, what they are famous for and any
	other interesting facts you have found out.
	 Practise reading through your script.
5	 With the support of an adult, record yourself reading your script using a camera,
	tablet or phone with video capabilities.
	 Watch your recording back and think about was good about it and how you could
	improve it next time.
